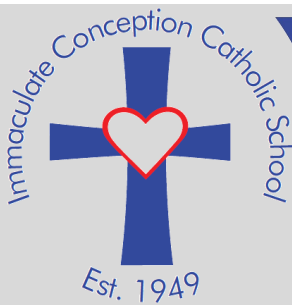

Our highlighted saint for the month is **St. John of Capistrano**. He was born in Italy in 1385.

St. John of Capistrano was an educated man who was appointed Governor of Perugia by the King of Naples. War broke out between Perugia and the Malatesta in 1416 and when St. John of Capistrano went to the Malatesta to propose peace they had him imprisoned. It was during this time of imprisonment that St. John of Capistrano began to think about his soul and had a dream in which St. Francis asked him to enter the Franciscan order.

St. John of Capistrano travelled to many countries preaching and healing the sick after he received the priesthood. He was eventually appointed by Pope Pius II to help the Christians defeat the Turkish army and prevent Turks from invading Hungary.

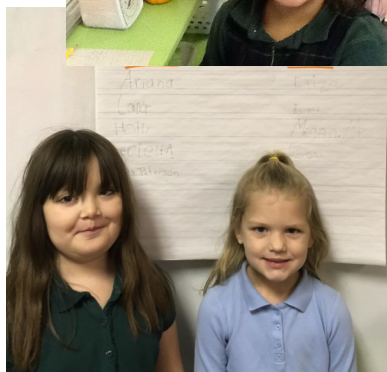


St. John of Capistrano is the patron saint of judges, lawyers and military chaplains.

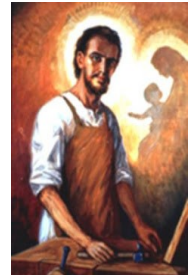
